If you've been following political events in Wales in the wake of the UK general election, you'll probably be aware of the response of the Labour administrations in Westminster and Cardiff to the Richard Commission's recommendations on increased powers for the Welsh Assembly – a disappointment to those who are seeking the provision in the short term of a Parliament for Wales with the power to make a difference.

It looks as if those aspirations will have to wait for another day, with possibly a change in the balance of power in Cardiff and Westminster being the driving force. It seems that those Welsh Labour MPs who've resisted increased devolution to Cardiff Bay will be able to hang on to their local power bases for a little while longer. In the meantime, time will tell how the Labour party in Cardiff copes with minority government, after the departure from the party of rebel AM & MP Peter Law.

The period since our last newsletter has also witnessed the passing of Gwynfor Evans, arguably one of the leading figures in Welsh politics of the 20th century, who despite (or perhaps because of) the fact that he never held office, managed to wield great influence during his lifetime. One of his lasting legacies must surely be the Welsh TV channel S4C, which would probably never have come into existence were it not for his actions, so it was appropriate that his funeral service was broadcast live from Aberystwyth by the TV channel that he did so much to establish. One of those extremely rare occasions – a Welsh state funeral.

- **Plaid pioneer Gwynfor Evans dies**

21/04/2005 Gwynfor Evans, Plaid Cymru's first MP, and one of Wales' leading political figures of the 20th Century, dies at 92.

- **Funeral service for Plaid pioneer**

27/04/2005 More than 2,000 people attended the funeral of Plaid Cymru's first MP, Gwynfor Evans, who died on April 21st at the age of 92. The town of Aberystwyth came to a standstill as a lone piper led the funeral cortège to Seion Chapel.

- **First national poet named**

29/04/2005 Gwyneth Lewis, who wrote the inscription at the front of the Wales Millennium Centre, has been named the country's first national poet. Ms Lewis will be inaugurated in her role at the Hay Literature Festival.

09/05/2005 Peter Hain last night went on the offensive against opposition parties who claim he will not be able to do the two jobs of Northern Ireland Secretary and Welsh Secretary.

- **Wigley urges Plaid to consider a coalition**

09/05/2005 Former Plaid Cymru president Dafydd Wigley has urged opposition parties in Wales to be prepared to form an alternative government after the next National Assembly elections in 2007.

- **Why a 'super university' is a must for Wales**

11/05/2005 A super university should be created in Wales by merging three institutions, claims a new report published today.

- **Why smokers in Wales could soon be pariahs**

11/05/2005 Wales could become a smoke-free nation within three years after a quest to ban smoking in public places took a major step forward yesterday.

- **Assembly reforms announced**

17/05/2005 The Queen has announced plans for reforming the Welsh assembly at the State Opening of Parliament. Details of the reforms were not laid out during the ceremony but a White Paper due for publication in July is expected to make those clear.

- **'Made in Wales' brand must be saved**

20/05/2005 The "Made in Wales" brand has sunk to its lowest ebb and the massive decline in manufacturing jobs must be stemmed, the Prime Minister was warned yesterday.

- **Top-up fees defeat weakens Rhodri**

25/05/2005 First Minister Rhodri Morgan was confronted with the reality of minority government yesterday as he was instructed by AMs not to introduce student top-up fees.

25/05/2005 The Swansea version of the board game Monopoly is to be bilingual after a poll of people living in the city. The manufacturers said place names will be in both English and Welsh when it goes on sale later this year.

27/05/2005 Mae llythyr a arwyddwyd gan yr arweinydd o Iwerddon, Padraig Pearse, ar ddiwedd Gwrthryfel 1916 wedi ei werthu am bron i £500,000 mewn ocswn yn Nulyn. Ysgrifennodd Pearse y llythyr yn ei gell yn y carchar ar Ebrill 30 1916, ychydig o ddyddiau cyn iddo gael ei ddienyddio.

- **Bright start for city Urdd**

31/05/2005 The Urdd Eisteddfod took up residence at its new home in Cardiff Bay yesterday with more than 20,000 visitors.

- **Move brings brighter future for London Welsh School**

02/06/2005 After living a hand-to-mouth existence for several years, the only Welsh-medium school outside Wales is facing a brighter future.

- **Iaith: 'Bygwth statws Gaeltacht'**
