**21/24 April 2004** – Two Welsh writers will be reading at this year's Cúirt International Festival of Literature in Galway. Trezza Azzopardi will read on Wednesday, 12 April at 2.30pm, and Jan Morris will speak and read on Saturday, 24 April, also at 2.30pm.

**8 May 2004** – Wales-Ireland Symposium, to be held at The Institute for International Integration Studies (IIIS) in Trinity College Dublin, on May 8 2004. There will be a comprehensive discussion of Welsh and Irish culture ranging from film to literature, and will feature innovative thinkers with academic and creative backgrounds from both Wales and Ireland.

18/12/2003 Attempts to establish a "super university" for Wales have been abandoned. Two rival Welsh institutes - the University of Wales Institute, Cardiff (Uwic) and the University of Glamorgan have been in talks for the past year. But governors at Uwic said yesterday they had terminated plans for the merger.

07/01/2004 Oscar-winning actor Sir Anthony Hopkins will welcome the gift of a Republic of Wales passport 'with open arms,' his agents in the United States said yesterday.
- **[Official: Now we can call ourselves Welsh](#)**  
12/01/2004 The Government has accepted for the first time that the Welsh have a distinctive ethnic identity. In the past, only groups like Indians, Bangladeshis, Africans and Irish have been able to tick boxes on official forms designating their ethnic background. Now, there will be boxes on such forms allowing people to describe themselves as Welsh, Scottish or English. British will also be an option.

21/01/2004 The Commission for Racial Equality today announced that it would be examining the way in which at least two universities in England were reported to have downgraded Welsh A level when choosing students for admission.
- **[Welsh author dies](#)**  
23/01/2004 The Welsh language novelist Islwyn Ffowc Elis has died at the age of 79. A pioneer of Welsh language fiction his best known work Cysgod Y Cryman (Shadow of the Sickle) sold more than any other Welsh novel.
- **[Labour pressed over law-making](#)**  
26/01/2004 The battle for the soul of Welsh Labour has moved into top gear with Assembly Cabinet Minister Carwyn Jones calling for full law-making powers at Cardiff Bay.
- **[Janet Street-Porter to star in Welsh Celebrity Big Brother](#)**  
28/01/2004 Janet Street-Porter, famed for her outbursts against the Welsh, is to take part in a celebrity version of the hit Welsh language show cariad@iaith. The broadcaster and journalist will join actress Ruth Madoc and other stars at the remote Nant Gwrtheyrn National Language Centre in north Wales for a week of Welsh lessons.

04/02/2004 Rhodri Morgan says he is in favour of law-making powers for the assembly - but not the ability to raise taxes.
- **[Tory bid to block Assembly on fees](#)**  
05/02/2004 Tories at Westminster have launched a bid to block the National Assembly from having its say on top-up fees following cross-party concerns they will "creep" into Wales after their introduction in England.
- **[WDA budget to be cut, says Plaid](#)**  
09/02/2004 The credibility of Assembly Economic Development Minister Andrew Davies was put on the line last night, as it was alleged swinging cuts in the Welsh Development Agency's business support budget are under consideration.
- **[The English are beginning to realise that they can't patronise the Welsh'](#)**  
09/02/2004 John Humphrys says Wales is no longer seen as being a backward nation by people in England.
- **[Group wants plaques to recall Patagonia exiles](#)**  
12/02/2004 The brave journey of 150 Welsh people who left for a better life in South America should be commemorated on both sides of the Atlantic, according to historical campaigners.
- **[Disney display of Wales is not Welsh](#)**  
17/02/2004 The National Assembly is being urged to do more for Wales' image after an AM's claim that the "Magic of Wales" display in Disney World, Florida had nothing directly Welsh in it.
- **[Owain Glyndwr's sword to be unveiled](#)**  
18/02/2004 The Welsh sword of state being made to commemorate Owain Glyndwr's coronation will be unveiled on May 1. Organisers Embassy Glyndwr are also calling on Welsh bards to write poems or songs in the sword's honour.

23/02/2004 Former Welsh Secretary Ron Davies is joining a political party set up by another former Labour politician, Wrexham AM John Marek. Mr Davies, who quit Labour a month ago after 40 years as a member saying devolution was in a mess, is joining the left-leaning Forward Wales.

01/03/2004 The first Welsh whisky to be made in more than 100 years is launched on St David's Day. Small independent firm the Welsh Whisky Company, based in the Brecon Beacons, is launching Penderyn single malt into a multi-million pound market dominated by drinks from Scotland and Ireland.
