Newsletter – Spring 2006

The first few months of 2006 have seen a number of developments in post-devolution Wales – some of these are included in our news links below. Of particular significance was the opening on St. David's Day of the new building in Cardiff to house the National Assembly of Wales. This building has been officially named the Senedd building – an interesting choice of name for those who have followed the devolution debate in Wales over the years, as “Senedd” is the Welsh word for “Parliament”. It remains to be seen whether the legislative powers associated with that name will be devolved to the Assembly in the near future, as recommended in the report of the Richard Commission. It seems that the people of Wales are still coming to terms with the existence of the Assembly and the new order of government in Wales, so perhaps it may take a little longer before the proposed developments will come to pass. St. David's Day in Wales also brought the now regular calls for March 1st to be declared a public holiday in Wales, a move supported by almost 90% of the population, if opinion polls are to be believed. However, as this is one of those decisions that have not been devolved to the Assembly, it requires the legislative assembly in Westminster (the British House of Commons, in other words) to make this decision, which presents problems when there are only 40 Welsh MPs out of a total of more than 630. However, this is not a new phenomenon to those who have studied Welsh politics over the years - the establishment of the Assembly was intended to counter these difficulties, but it seems that there is some way to go before that becomes reality. Time will tell.

In the meantime, we in Draig Werdd carried on regardless, and celebrated our national day with an informal dinner and entertainment in Old Belvedere Rugby Club in Dublin on the eve of the Ireland-Wales rugby match – visit www.draigwerdd.org for photos of some of those who were present. Cylchlythyr – Gwanwyn 2006

Yn ystod misoedd cyntaf 2006 gwlewyd nifer o ddatblygiadau yn y Gymru ôl-ddatganoledig - a chynhwysir rhai o'r rhain ymhlið ein dolennau isod. O arwyddocâd arbennig roedd agor yr adeilad newydd yng Nghaerdydd yn gartref i Gynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru. Fe'i henwyd yn swyddogol yn Adeilad y Senedd - dewis diddorol i'r rhai ohonom sydd wedi dilyn y ddadl ynghylch datganoli yng Nghymru dros y blynnyddoedd, gan fod iddo awgrym o 'senedd' go iawn. Bydd raid aros i weld a roddir i'r Cynulliad y pwerau deddfwriaethol hynny y byddai rhywun yn ei gysylltu â senedd-dy, fel ag a argymhellwyd yn adroddiad Comisiwn Richard. Mae'n ymddangos mai dim ond dod i arfer yn raddol bach â'r Cynulliad ac â'r drefn lywodraethol newydd y mae'r Cymry, ac efallai y bydd angen ychydig mwy o amser cyn y gwreddir y datblygiadau hynny. Eleni, fel sy'n rheolaidd bellach, gwelodd Dydd Gŵyl Dewi alwadau'n cael eu gwneud i'w wneud yn ddiwrnod gŵyl cyhoeddus, peth a gefnogir gan 90% o'r boblogaeth, os oes coel ar y polau piniwn. Ond am fod hwn yn un o'r penderfyniadau hynny na ddatgalanwyd i'r Cynulliad, byddai angen cynulliad deddfu San Steffan (Tŷ Cyffredin Prydain, mewn geiriau eraill) i'w wireddu, a chan nad oes ond 40 aelod seneddol Cymreig, allan o fwy na 630, nid mater hawdd mo hynny. Nid yw hon yn ffenomen newydd i'r rhai sydd wedi astudio gwleidyddiaeth Cymru dros y blynnyddoedd - roedd sefydlu'r Cynulliad i fod i ddatrys anawsterau o'r fath, ond mae cryn ffordd i fynd cyn y gwelwn hynny'n digwydd. Amser a ddengys.

Yn y cyfamser buom ni yn Draig Werdd yn dal ati yn ôl ein harfer, ac yn dathlu ein diwrnod cenedlaethol gyda swper anffurfiol ac adloniant yng Nghwlby Rygbi Old Belvedere, y noson cyn y gêm rygbi rhwng Cymru ac Iwerddon.
