Raising their profile in Wales at the moment are politicians of all parties, who are moving into top gear in the run-up to the Assembly elections, which will be taking place on 3rd May - see the news item links on the next page for a number of entries relating to the election. A close result is expected, the question being as to whether the current Labour government will gain enough seats to remain in power, or whether a coalition of some of the current opposition parties will form the next government. As part of our aim of promoting Welsh affairs within Ireland, we will be keeping as many people as possible informed of progress over the next few weeks, and will be able to review the situation in our next newsletter.

Unfortunately, one of the decisions that a new administration in Cardiff will not be able to make is the establishment of St. David's Day as a national holiday in Wales, despite overwhelming support for this within Wales itself. This decision can only be made by the Westminster government, as it happens, so we'll have to wait for a change of mind there. Or else a change in the way that Wales is governed – but that's another story!

Fel rhan o'n amcan o hyrwyddo materion Cymreig yn Iwerddon, mi fyddwn yn darparu gwybodaeth am yr etholiad dros yr wythnosau nesaf, a byddwn hefyd yn trafod y sefyllfa yn ein cylchlythyr nesaf.
