



Our autumn newsletter once again contains a digest of news items relating to Wales and Welsh-Irish relationships which have appeared during the summer. Of particular interest is the debate over increased powers for the Welsh assembly, as advocated earlier this year by the Richard commission – powers which would go a long way to delivering the long sought-for Welsh Parliament.

The governing Labour party's response to this has been mixed, with enthusiasm amongst Labour's Assembly members being countered by hostility from Labour's MPs in the southern industrial constituencies – worried that their own relevance may be sidelined, perhaps? In any case, Labour's absolute majority in the Assembly since the last election and the presence of a Labour government in Westminster means that whatever anybody else thinks, it's what the Labour party thinks that will control the outcome. Things are thankfully not so complicated for us in Draig Werdd – we just need to hold our AGM, which is taking place this year at 8pm on Tuesday evening, October 12th, in the upstairs room in Scruffy Murphy's in Dublin.
